We own nearly 8,000 public housing units and administer federal subsidies for an additional 11,000 families who rent from private landlords in every Ward across the District.

Formed as an independent agency of the DC government just ten years ago, DCHA has



earned a national reputation for securing federal housing grants. In fact, we garnered the second highest number of US Department of Housing and Urban Development HOPE VI grants in the country. Working with private and nonprofit partners, we have leveraged this \$181 million in grants into \$1.5 billion in community economic redevelopment in the District.

Ms. Spriggs' journey attests to her tenacity, because the subsidized house she was renting went into foreclosure, so she had to move to an apartment while her house was being completed.

In addition to finally getting the keys to her home, Ms. Spriggs said it was extra special because she was able to surprise her children, since they didn't know when they were moving. When asked how she felt today, she said she felt "overwhelmed, overjoyed, relieved and very blessed."
