2013 Application Procedures and Checklist

BACKGROUND

The District of Columbia Housing Authority (DCHA) is committed to ensuring that the District's public housing stock is both affordable and sustainable. Sustainable DC is a city-wide initiative of Mayor Vincent C. Gray aimed at transforming the District of Columbia into the greenest, most sustainable city in the U.S. by 2032. In 2012, DCHA was awarded a Sustainable DC grant to explore clean energy generation at the historic Langston Dwellings. Langston Dwellings, the first public housing site in D.C. and the second public housing site in the nation ,was designed by notable African-American architect Hilyard Robinson as a coal-powered site. Langston Dwellings is uniquely positioned to power a sustainable DC by ushering in a new future built on clean, renewable energy.

In furtherance of Mayor Gray's vision and DCHA's endeavoring to engage its students who are interested in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (S.T.E.M.), this one-time academic scholarship is being offered. DCHA's mission is to provide quality affordable housing to extremely low- through moderate-income households, foster sustainable communities, and cultivate opportunities for residents to improve their lives.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicant must:

- Graduate in June 2013 with a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher; have a high school diploma with a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher; have a GED; or be currently enrolled in a college, university, or trade/technical school.
- Confirm full-time admission to or enrollment in a two-year or four-year college, university, or trade/technical school.
- Reside on a DCHA property or have a Housing Choice Voucher (verified by the lease). Preference will be given to residents of Langston Terrace.
- Plan to pursue or currently pursue a degree or certification in Science, Technology, Engineering, or Math (S.T.E.M.). Majors and minors include, but are not limited to: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Architecture, Internet Technology, Mechanical Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Chemical Engineering, and Statistics. Students majoring/minoring in Urban Agriculture and/or Sustainability are encouraged to apply as well.

AWARDS

The \$10,000 in scholarships will be awarded as follows:

- One (1) \$5,000 scholarship will be awarded to a selected applicant with a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Two (2) \$2,500 scholarships will be awarded to selected applicants with a GPA of 2.8 or higher

SCHOLARSHIP PAYMENTS

Scholarship awards are to be used for **tuition**, **fees**, **room**, **board**, **books**, **and school supplies ONLY**. Payments will be made directly to the college, university, or trade/technical school. Payments will be processed once verification of enrollment is received.
